I am writing this letter to confirm the collaboration between the Hong Kong Baptist University (HKBU) Centre for Innovative Service-learning (CISL) and Dr Cecilia Chan in her Research Impact Fund proposal on the assessment of generic skills. Partnering on this project would be a great way to benchmark against other institutions across Asia and share innovative practices.

Dr Chan's research proposal matches with the mission and plans of CISL which is to provide academic service-learning opportunities for students and developing approaches to assess student learning and measure impact. The validated student perception inventory on generic skills, which Dr Chan developed has already been used by students in HKBU and five other universities (HKUST, CUHK, LU, EduHK and HKU) in Hong Kong in a previous collaboration.
